Establish fees and charges to defray costs of administration 4. Establish criteria for inspector and plan examiner certification program, and establish a program to certify these professionals to allow them to implement and enforce mandated codes and standards 5. Establish criteria for suspension or revocation of inspector and plans examiner certifications 6. Establish process for local government to petition the Board for modifications to the codes and standards - If the local government does not conduct inspections and examine plans, the State will do it and can charge a fee to do so -
