Fostering Community Engagement and Understanding in the Behavioral Health System	Require Managed Service Organizations, Community Mental Health Centers, Crisis Contractors (Administrative Services Organizations) and Regional Accountability Entities (RAEs) to practice good governance provisions <u>and</u> pursue a fiscal and performance audit of the behavioral health system to examine whether or not statutory requirements are being met and to better understand the sufficiency and use of public funding in the entirety of the behavioral health system.	<i>Never introduced</i>  Reps. 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Require DOC to Coordinate with Local Communities on Work Release Programs	The State Department of Corrections (DOC) is developing work release programs without local community participation. Seek a statutory change that ensures proper coordination and communication with community correction boards, local elected officials and local law enforcement. Enhance Public Safety Funding by Increasing Traffic Infraction Fines	Traffic infraction fines have not been increased in Colorado since 1975. Seek a statutory increase in the fines for A and B class infractions (such as driving without a license or insurance). The additional money would enhance the Victim's Assistance and Law Enforcement (VALE) grant program and provide additional funding for local public safety needs.	<a href="#">SB20-070</a> Sen.
