Child Protection/Adult Protection info sharing and records requests	<p>Amend C.R.S. 26-3.1.-102 (probably subsection (7) and C.R.S. 19-1-303 and/or 19-1-307) to allow sharing of information between both Child Protection and Adult Protection agencies. Currently, statutes do not allow for the sharing of information between agencies but often times there are investigations by both types of workers on the same family.</p> <p>Amended C.R.S. 26-3.1-102(7) to add “(b)(III) Any person named in the report or record who was alleged as a vulnerable adult to be abused or neglected, or if the person named in the report or record is a minor or is otherwise incompetent at the time of the request, his or his guardian.” This change will align adult protection statutes with the authority that exists now for youth who are subject to abuse to request their own records.</p>	HB19-1063 Reps. Gallagher Amendment	Continue to work on a solution to Gallagher that will impact the <u>2021</u> residential assessment rate. (Note: Pursuant to the constitution, the 2019 residential assessment rate will be set by the legislature in April 2019.) This may entail amendments to the Gallagher Interim Committee bills and/or another approach forward.	Pending	Gini Pingenot	
Remove Fee Cap Electrical Inspection Local Government	If counties choose to conduct electrical inspections in their county (which 17 currently do), their inspection fees must track with the state inspection fees – regardless of the actual local cost to conduct inspections. Amend C.R.S. 12-23-117(2) to allow counties to set their own electrical inspection fees to allow them to recoup the actual costs of conducting electrical inspections.	HB19-1035 Reps. 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County Authority Unclaimed Body Final Disposition	Counties are currently responsible for paying burial costs for indigents. Cremation is a much less expensive alternative to burial. Amend C.R.S. 30-17-104 to give counties the option to either cremate or bury the remains of unclaimed indigents.	SB19-027 Sen. Public Trustee Appointments in Class 2 Counties	Currently, the governor appoints the public trustee in the Class 2 counties (Adams, Arapahoe, Boulder, Douglas, El Paso, Jefferson, Larimer, Mesa, Pueblo and Weld). Amend C.R.S. 38-37-102 to assign the duties of the public trustee to the county treasurer.	Pending	Eric Bergman	
Publish County Financial Reports Online Annually	Amend C.R.S. 30-25-111 to allow counties the option to publish various financials (monthly warrants, salaries and financial reports) on the county website as an alternative to publishing in the local newspaper. Use of Electrical Service Provider Infrastructure for Broadband	Modify Colorado statute to permit the use of existing easements controlled by electrical service providers to utilize previously installed and new communications infrastructure to carry additional network traffic not associated with the control and management of the electrical network. Documentation Review Fee for Landfill Reporting	Amend C.R.S. to change documentation and review fee for county landfill reporting costs. Solid Waste and Hazardous Materials Division hourly rate should mirror hourly rate of local land use and/or landfill operator.	Pending	Bill Clayton & Tony Lombard	
Underfunded Courthouse Facility Commission Changes	Amend C.R.S. 13-1-301 to allow all counties to be eligible for grant funds and to make the grant funding more flexible to better meet the needs of county courthouses.	Pending	Allison Daley
