

Amendments Added in Both Chambers

- \$6 million cash funds from the Public School Capital Construction Assistance Fund to the Department of Education for lease purchase payments by the Building Excellent Schools Today (BEST) program
- \$2 million General Fund to the Department of Local Affairs to be credited to the Peace Officers Mental Health Support Fund for grants
- \$6.4 million total funds, including \$3.2 million general fund to HCPF for increased homemaker, personal care and consumer directed services
- \$9,432,147 General Fund to increase salaries for direct care staff at the Colorado Mental Health Institute at Fort Logan and the Colorado Mental Health Institute at Pueblo
- \$3 million Marijuana Tax Cash Funds for CDHS for Increasing Access to Effective Substance Use Disorder Services (SB 16-202) line item
- \$234,457 to increase the hourly pay of certified court interpreters to the Judicial Department
- \$50,000 General Fund for the Youth Advisory Council
- \$20,000 General Fund to the Legislative Department for closed captioning for the Colorado Channel
- General Fund for Affordable Housing Construction Grants
 - \$1 million in the House, \$5 million in the Senate (conference committee will determine final amount)
- \$4,758,600 Marijuana Tax Cash Funds for housing assistance for persons with behavioral or mental health disorders who are transitioning from incarceration, consistent with SB 17-021
- Marijuana Tax Cash Funds for medical marijuana research grants
 - \$4 million in the House, \$3 million in the Senate
- \$35 million General Fund to the School Safety Resource Center Cash Fund in the Department of Public Safety. Reduces state share of district total program funding and replaces that same amount with cash funds

- \$2 million General Fund to the Department of Public Safety for wildfire preparedness
- \$300,000 General Fund for the Department of Public Safety for child abuse investigations
- Inserts line item and funding for Colorado Civil Rights Division
- \$400,000 to CDPHE for suicide prevention

Amendments Added Only in the Senate

- Reduces \$224,992 General Fund and 2 FTE from the Governor's State Broadband Office and gives that money to the Department of Regulatory Agencies for rural broadband
- Adds a footnote directing the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing to reinstate 2015 physical therapy reimbursement rates for reevaluation
- \$3,688,169 total funds, including \$2,950,535 General Fund and \$737,634 Cash Funds for CDHS for transportation of foster care youth as required by the federal Every Student Succeeds Act
- \$3 million General Fund to CDHS for Rural Co-occurring Disorder Services to expand access to residential treatment services in northeastern Colorado for individuals with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders
- \$245,777 General Fund for judicial transcripts
- \$55,000 General Fund for strategic plan on aging
- \$8 million General Fund to DORA for rural broadband

Amendments Added Only in the House

- \$500,000 General Fund to the Department of Corrections for inmate pay
- Footnote related to film incentives and diversity of workforce
- Takes \$250,000 from film incentives and gives to School Safety
- \$800,000 total funds, including \$400,000 General Fund to HCPF for medical services premiums for adult day services
- \$1,178,882 General Fund for technical colleges. Supplants other funds to be cost neutral for the General Fund

- \$1 million Marijuana Tax Cash Funds for Tony Grampas Youth Services
- \$650,000 Marijuana Tax Cash Funds for programs for high risk pregnant women
- \$400,000 Marijuana Tax Cash Funds for crisis response services at CDHS and youth mental health programming at CDPHE
- \$6 million General Fund for the Circle Program to expand services to Western and Northeastern Colorado
- \$150,000 to CDHS for service dogs for veterans
- \$3 million General Fund for victims grants from probation services in Judicial
- \$321,934 and 4 FTE for construction site audits
- \$69,000 General Fund for Judicial for an additional Child Welfare Ombudsman
- \$500,000 cash funds from the Oil and Gas Conservation and Environmental Response Fund and 1 FTE for oil and gas health activities
- \$296,646 to DPS for intensive residential treatment beds
- \$575,000 General Fund to DPS for subsistence payments
- \$295,517 General Fund and 5.2FTE to DPS for the Safe2Tell program
