



Protection of Public Health Workers

Background

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought increased responsibilities for public health workers tasked with monitoring and preventing the spread of the disease. Throughout Colorado and across the country there have been instances of local public health officials facing threats and vandalism. Instances in Colorado have included vandalized cars, poisoned dogs, a photograph with comments about “bodies swinging from trees,” and the arrest of a man who said health officials “deserve to pay.”¹

There have also been several incidences of personal addresses of these public health workers shared through social media and protests at the private residences of local public health directors.² For example, 9News reported in December that a group in a metro county “published name and home addresses of public health employees online with veiled threats of retribution for COVID-19 restrictions”³.

In May, after polling local public health directors across the state, CALPHO found about 80% said they or their personal property had been threatened since the pandemic began⁴. Nineteen of the 54 local public health agencies have had directors who have left their positions or plan to do so in the near future. This is due in part to the difficult environment that includes threats and concerns for their personal safety and the safety of their families.

HB21-1107 seeks to protect the personal information of public health workers and their families, providing them the same personal information protections that currently exist for certain human service workers.

HB21-1107

This bill protects the personal information of certain public health workers of CDPHE or county or district public health agencies, who are engaged in specific public health duties. The bill also allows eligible workers to submit a written request to a state or local government official to remove personal information from public records that are available on the internet.

Personal information includes their home address, home telephone number, personal mobile telephone number, personal e-mail address, or a personal photograph.

Current law (or HB21-1015) provides these protections for law enforcement officers, human services workers and their families when the dissemination of the personal information poses an imminent and serious threat to safety of the public health worker or their family. Violation of the prohibition on sharing of personal information is a class 1 misdemeanor.
