

**STANDING PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER 2020-05 LOCAL ADOPTION OF ROUTT COUNTY "ROAD TO RECOVERY" DIAL TO CURTAIL THE SPREAD OF DISEASE**

**ROUTT COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH**

**Recitals**

A. Routt County Resolution 2009-018, established the Routt County Public Health Agency, pursuant to C.R.S. § 25-1-506, designating the Board of County Commissioners of Routt County as the Routt County Board of Health ("Board of Health").

B. Public Health has the statutory authority to investigate and control the causes of epidemic or communicable diseases and conditions affecting public health, as well as to establish, maintain, and enforce isolation and quarantine, and to exercise physical control over persons within its jurisdiction as necessary for the protection of public health. C.R.S. § 25-1-506 (3)(b)(V) and (VI).

C. Public Health has the statutory authority to close schools and public places and to prohibit gatherings of people when necessary to protect public health. C.R.S. § 25-1-506.

D. Public Health has jurisdiction for both incorporated and unincorporated Routt County. C.R.S. § 25-1-506(2)(a).

E. The Director General of the World Health Organization has declared that COVID-19 constitutes a Public Health Emergency of International Concern and characterized it as a pandemic. The Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services has declared COVID-19 constitutes a public health emergency and on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared a National Emergency. On March 10, 2020, Colorado Governor Jared Polis declared a State of Disaster Emergency and that declaration continues. The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment has confirmed that COVID-19 continues to spread throughout the State of Colorado, and community transmission of the illness has been confirmed in Routt County. On March 13, 2020, Routt County declared a local disaster and that declaration continues.

F. As of April 15, 2021, there have been over 483,800 cases of COVID-19 in Colorado and over 2,100 cases in Routt County.

G. Routt County continues to experience COVID-19 cases. The intent of this Order is to minimize contact among individuals and reduce the public's exposure to COVID-19 in an effort to prevent disease and aid in the loosening of restrictions in the County.

H. These actions are some of the most available and effective tools to help slow the spread of the virus in our community, and, importantly, to reduce the number of potential deaths caused by COVID-19. By slowing the spread, we have a chance to protect our family, friends,

and neighbors who are at risk of severe illness. In particular, this includes all adults over age 60 and anyone with an underlying health condition.

I. These actions will limit the cascading impacts on critical services due to high absenteeism if large numbers of workers become ill. This Order and actions will help hospitals, first responders, and other healthcare services continue to provide services for those who need them (along with utilities, human services, and businesses) in the coming weeks and months. Collective action can save lives and is in support of the most vulnerable in our community. The more united we can be in preventing the spread, the greater the benefit for the whole community.

J. On November 2, 2020, Jill Hunsaker Ryan, MPH, the Executive Director of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) entered Public Health Order 20-36 implementing levels of restrictions for individuals, businesses, and activities to prevent the spread of COVID-19 (the "COVID-19 Dial") and has also entered amendments from time to time.

K. On November 13, 2020 Routt County adopted the State's COVID-19 Dial framework as part of the County's Public Health Order making the County subject to the State's Dial.

L. In addition to the restrictions imposed by the COVID-19 Dial, the County adopted additional restrictions based on public health concerns specific to Routt County.

M. On April 7, 2021, April 14, 2021, and April 16, 2021, the Board of Health held public meetings wherein Public Health officials updated the Board of Health on specific concerns involving the spread of COVID-19 in Routt County and the fact that the State announced its intent to rescind or amend the COVID-19 Dial and recommended that the Board of Health adopt new Orders in consideration of those anticipated changes.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. This Order is effective within the entirety of Routt County, including all cities and towns within the County.

2. The issuance of this Order is deemed reasonable and necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare.

3. **Incorporation of State Orders.** All Executive Orders issued by the Governor and all CDPHE Public Health Orders are hereby adopted and deemed incorporated herein.

4. **Compliance with State Orders.** In order to safely open and operate, businesses and other entities allowed to operate must comply with all Executive Orders issued by the Governor and all CDPHE Public Health Orders.

5. **Cooperation with Contact Tracing, Case Investigation, Outbreak Investigations, Quarantine Orders, and Isolation Orders.** All individuals shall cooperate with contact tracing, case investigation, and outbreak investigation efforts conducted by Routt County Public Health as well as any quarantine or isolation orders issued by Public Health and the Routt County Medical Officer.

6. **Routt County Road to Recovery (Local Dial) Metrics.** The following non-exclusive metrics will be considered to identify the County's then-current status on a Local Dial as set forth below utilizing a fourteen (14) day rolling average:

**Low Risk**

- a. Fewer than fifty-two (52) new cases within a fourteen (14) day time period -OR- 75% vaccination level of Routt County residents sixteen (16) years of age or older.
- b. Less than five (5) percent test positivity rate.
- c. Local and/or regional hospital capacity is not limited.

**Caution**

- a. Fifty-two (52) to two hundred fifty-six (256) new cases within a fourteen (14) day time period.
- b. Five (5) percent to ten (10) percent test positivity rate.
- c. Local and/or regional hospital capacity is not strained.

**High Risk**

- a. More than two hundred and fifty-six (256) new COVID-19 cases within a fourteen (14) day time period.
- b. Ten (10) percent or greater test positivity rate.
- c. Local and/or regional hospitals at eighty-five percent (85%) or greater capacity.

**Additional Considerations**

- a. Each metric is independent of other metrics such that any single metric may trigger the appropriate Local Dial Level.
- b. Metrics requiring a more restrictive Level shall take precedence.

c. Metrics must be maintained at least seven (7) consecutive days before effectuating any change in Level.

7. **Routt County Road to Recovery (Local Dial) Restrictions.** The following restrictions apply at the specified Local Dial Level:

**Low Risk.** Individuals must comply with all State Executive Orders and Public Health Orders and the following local restriction:

a. **Face Coverings.** All individuals over the age of two shall cover their nose and mouth with a face covering when in public indoor spaces unless the nature of the business (such as dentistry or personal care) requires the removal of the face covering. All individuals over the age of two shall cover their nose and mouth with face coverings when in public outdoor spaces or maintain a distance of at least six (6) feet from any other person who is not a member of their household. Face coverings are not required when individuals are alone in a private space.

**Caution.** Individuals and entities must comply with these local restrictions:

a. The Face Covering requirement set forth in Low Risk Level.

b. Distancing requirements. Individuals shall maintain at least six (6) feet of distance from other individuals who are non-household members.

c. Indoor and outdoor events open to the public that are expecting five hundred (500) or more people must have a COVID-19 Mitigation Protocol as described in Section 8 below and such Protocol must be approved by Routt County Public Health.

d. **Business Requirements.** This Section applies to any individual, business or organization, including for profit or non-profit, regardless of its corporate structure, engaged in any commercial, manufacturing, or service activities (collectively "Business"). For the purposes of this Order, the term "employee" shall include owners, contractors, subcontractors, workers, and volunteers regardless of the absence of any employer-employee relationship.

1. Businesses shall not allow employees showing any symptoms or signs of sickness or who are subject to isolation or quarantine orders to work at the Business or remain on the Business' premises.

2. Businesses must meet or exceed the hygiene practices set forth in the following publications:

3. Businesses must post the following signage in a clear and visible place:

i. Signage that states face coverings are required to enter any public indoor space pursuant to public health orders.

ii. Signage promoting good hygiene practices, including washing hands and distancing.

iii. Signage prohibiting anyone showing any symptoms or signs of sickness from entering.

4. Businesses shall arrange their indoor space or seating areas to accommodate six (6) foot distancing. If outdoor spaces are available at the business, three (3) foot distancing is required outdoors. Individuals who are not members of the same household may be seated at the same table within six (6) feet of each other, however, there shall be no more than ten (10) individuals per table.

5. Bars without food service are prohibited from operating within indoor settings. Furthermore, bar seating is prohibited unless the bar is also used for food service.

6. Public transportation service providers may operate at seventy-five percent (75%) capacity. Those transportation service providers engaged in interstate commerce may operate at one hundred percent (100%) capacity. Face coverings shall be worn by all drivers and passengers for the duration of the transportation service and passengers shall be provided hand sanitizer before entering the vehicle.

7. Businesses must adopt policies to reduce densities in indoor areas (e.g. using reservation systems and eliminating communal or “seat yourself” options) and must implement or update Mitigation Protocols pursuant to the requirements set forth in Section 8 below.

**High Risk.** Individuals and Businesses must comply with the following restrictions:

- a. All local restrictions set forth above for Caution Level.
- b. All provisions of the CDPHE “Tenth Amended Public Health Order 20-36 COVID-19 Dial” dated April 4, 2021 for Level Orange: High Risk. This incorporation of the CDPHE Order shall have full effect regardless of any State action that may make the State’s COVID-19 Dial voluntary or optional and shall remain enforceable as an Order of the Routt County Board of Health.
- c. If this Order contradicts those requirements set forth in the “Tenth Amended Public Health Order 20-36 COVID-19 Dial” dated April 4, 2021 for Level Orange: High Risk, this Order shall prevail.

**8. Mitigation Protocol.**

- a. All Businesses at which there is more than one person present at any time (whether employees or members of the public) must prepare a “Mitigation Protocol” for each facility or operational location in Routt County. The Mitigation Protocol must be substantially in the form attached to this Order as Appendix A.
- b. If the Business is conducting an indoor or outdoor event at a public or commercial space with 25 or more attendees, the Business must prepare an Event Mitigation Protocol for each event. The Event Mitigation Protocol must be substantially in the form attached to this Order as Appendix B. This was formerly known as a Self-Certification Form. The Event Mitigation Protocol shall be submitted to Routt County Public Health at least 15 days in advance of the event.
- c. The Mitigation Protocol must be posted at or near the entrance of each facility and shall be easily viewable by the public and employees. A copy of the Mitigation Protocol must also be provided to each employee performing work at the facility.
- d. All Businesses shall provide evidence of its Mitigation Protocol to any authority enforcing this Order upon demand.
- e. Failure to develop and post a Mitigation Protocol, the inability to meet the requirements of the Mitigation Protocol and/or this Order may result in a penalty or

enforcement, including closure of the business and/or criminal prosecution, as allowed by law.

f. The responsibility for compliance with this order shall apply to the owner of the Business and owner of the property on which the facility or event is located. In addition, each employee or member of the public utilizing the facilities of the Business shall be personally responsible for their own compliance with this Order.

g. Any Business that provides more stringent mitigation and social distancing requirements shall be deemed to have met the intent of this Order.

9. **Most Restrictive Standard Controls.** To the extent any State and/or Federal orders or laws are more restrictive than what is set forth herein, such orders control. Individuals should be aware that new orders from the Governor and CDPHE are being issued on a regular basis, and all members of the public are responsible for following the Governor's orders, CDPHE orders, and local orders. Any more restrictive Routt County provisions shall control.


10. **Judicial Review.** Any person aggrieved and affected by this Order has the right to request judicial review by filing an action with the Routt County District Court within 90 days of the date of this Order, pursuant to C.R.S. § 25-1-515. However, you must continue to obey the terms of this Order while your request for review is pending.

11. **Penalties.** This Order is enforceable and failure to comply with this Order may subject the person to the penalties contained in C.R.S. §§ 25-1-516 and 18-1.3-501, including a fine of up to five thousand dollars (\$5,000) and imprisonment in the county jail for up to eighteen (18) months and may subject the person to a civil action for damages.

12. This Order is effective as of April 16, 2021 at 3 p.m. and is in effect through June 2, 2021, unless extended or earlier rescinded.

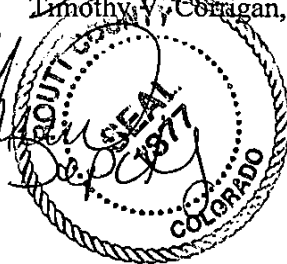
