Middle-income housing has – as in many other states – historically been neglected in Colorado, leaving many without affordable and appropriate options. This type of housing bridges the gap between market-rate housing, which is increasingly unaffordable in the state, and low-income housing, which relies on tools like the popular low-income housing tax credit for financial viability. Middle-income housing options are bolstered by opportunities like the new Colorado Middle Income Housing Tax Credit (MIHTC) and innovations in public-private partnerships.

This session will provide a brief introduction to middle-income housing, explaining what it is and its importance in creating robust, economically resilient communities. We'll explore current and anticipated funding and development options and discuss how counties can most effectively partner with developers, state agencies, and other stakeholders to get middle-income housing projects across the finish line.

During the 2024 Legislative Session, the legislature, with the help of the Property Tax Commission, passed SB24-233, Property Tax, which Governor Polis signed into law. The measure provided the property tax relief that many have been seeking in the post-Gallagher world, while providing local governments with a predictable rate for both residential and non-residential properties. The bill has been described as "the biggest bipartisan deal" of the 2024 Session, and the largest property tax reduction in Colorado history. 


